Questions and Answers

1. Can we look in to the traffic speed on Red Post Lane?

Cllr Hayter responded that we had already received correspondence regarding Red Post Lane and Hampshire Highways have been approached about this. They are unwilling to look at any reduction in speed unless there is a serious accident. AAPC will be looking into how funds from the ANPR can help the parish monitor traffic speed in the parish.

AAPC said they would publish the letter from Hampshire Highways on the website.

2. What is happening with ANPR and Goodmans planning applications?

Cllr Hayter said that there has been detailed communications and that AAPC may apply the Freedom of Information Act if the council is not more forthcoming.

3. What is AAPC doing about St Johns Cross and the Bus Bay?

Cllr Hayter replied that Hampshire County Council were responsible for the Bus Bay and that they have tried persuade the school bus company to drive through the village to collect children, however unfortunately this was not something they were willing to do. A solution needs to be found and AAPC are working with HCC and TVBC to solve this problem.

4. What is happening with The Green?

Cllr Hayter that replied we have a 99 year lease, a copy of the lease is available on the village website in the parish council section. Going forward, the proposal is that the wildflower meadow is moved to the Green from the Burial Ground and some initial plans have been drawn up and will be published.

5. Village Hall Grounds - Who is responsible for the maintenance?

Cllr Hayter explained that AAPC now has a Maintenance contract in place and the War Memorial Hall grounds falls under this contract. Following up on a specific question, we will ask that the contractor plays attention to grass growing along the fence line.
